

## Programs & Courses

We offer **two masters degrees: Master of Pastoral Studies and Master of Theological Studies.** Either degree requires 14 courses, or 42 semester hours of credit. The main difference between the degrees is that the MPS requires more ministry courses, and the MTS requires more theology courses.

As stepping stones toward the degree, you may earn a Certificate of Theological Studies (4 courses) and an Advanced Diploma of Christian Ministry (7 courses). All courses count towards the master's degree. After completing seven courses, you may formally enter one of the Master's degree programs.

## Incarnational Trinitarian theology

We believe that theology should be rooted in the Bible, especially the New Testament. We see a reliable theology articulated by Irenaeus, Athanasius, Gregory Nazianzus, and more recently, Karl Barth, Thomas F. Torrance, and many others. Our teachings include:

The Triune God created all people through the Son of God, who also is known as the Word of God.

We were created so that we could participate in the love relationship enjoyed by the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

We are enabled and qualified to participate in this relationship of love through Jesus Christ.

The Son became human, the man Jesus Christ, taking on our human nature.

He did this to reconcile all humanity to God through his birth, life, death, resurrection and ascension.

The crucified, resurrected and glorified Jesus is the representative and the substitute for all humanity.

As Savior and Lord of all humanity, Jesus now sits at the right hand of the Father, and he draws all people to himself by the Holy Spirit.

In Christ, humanity is loved and accepted by the Father.

Jesus Christ paid for all our sins— past, present and future— so there is no longer any debt to pay.

The Father has in Christ forgiven all our sins, and he eagerly desires that we receive his forgiveness.

We can enjoy his love only as we trust that he loves us. We can enjoy his forgiveness only when we trust he has forgiven us.

As we respond to the Spirit by turning to God, believing the gospel and picking up our cross and following Jesus, the Spirit leads us into the transformed life of the kingdom of God.

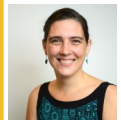

### Q & A

**Do I have to be a pastor to apply?** We welcome students from all walks of life who want to take classes for personal and/or professional enrichment.

**What are the admission requirements?** A bachelor's degree is required for entry into the master's degree programs. Students with some college credit may also apply, and take courses on a continuing education basis, and in some circumstances may eventually be admitted to the master's degree program.

**What is the cost?** Tuition is \$600 per course and a master's degree is \$8,450 plus application and book costs, which is less than most seminaries.

**Do I have to make a long-term commitment?** No. All students begin in the category of continuing education, taking courses according to their own interest. There is no obligation to take more courses.

**Will this enable me to get a job as a pastor?** Our courses are designed to help students do better at what they are currently doing. If it helps you get a job, we rejoice with you, but we cannot make any promises about jobs.
