

CM512 Small Group Bible Study Leadership Short Syllabus

Instructor: Gary Deddo, PhD, assisted by Cathy Deddo, MA

Course description

This course will train students to lead a small group for church congregations that are centered around Bible studies that contribute to a growing faith, hope and love for Jesus Christ. Students will learn and practice the skills needed to prepare for and lead Bible studies that foster fellowship, spiritual maturity and a vision for service, outreach and mission.

Estimated workload: For a student to do well in this course, the student will need to invest a total of 144 hours, or about 12 hours per week of reading, participating on the website, and writing papers.

Student learning outcomes

This course fits primarily into the fourth GCS student learning outcome: Conduct the work of pastoral ministry in witness to and representation of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Through this course, students will...

- First SLO. Identify the Trinitarian and incarnational biblical and theological foundations for Bible study centered small fellowship or discipleship groups
 - Reading textbooks, lectures/note, handouts, demonstrated through forums, exercises and final project
- 2. Second SLO: create dynamic formats for Bible study centered small group meetings that include other interactive elements such as hospitality, prayer, sharing.
 - Textbooks, forums, Final Project

- 3. Third SLO: Choose and use appropriate resources to study and prepare to lead a small group Bible study
 - Textbooks, weekly exercises, Response to Mark Papers and Final Project
- 4. Fourth SLO: identify and demonstrate the use of the fundamental guidelines for proper biblical interpretation in a small group setting.
 - Video demonstrations, reading textbooks and handouts, weekly exercises, forums, Response to Mark papers, Final Project
- Fifth SLO: Formulate appropriate discussion questions for leading the Bible study portion of a small group fellowship/discipleship meeting
 Video demonstrations, textbooks, handouts, weekly exercises, Final Project
- 6. Sixth SLO: Recognize key small group dynamics that contribute to healthy fellowship and Bible study discussion and common pitfalls to avoid.

Requirements and assignments

- 1. **Read the lectures and class notes.** Lectures will be posted each Monday for the first ten weeks. See the *Academic Catalog* for study suggestions. You should look up any scripture references in the lectures.
- 2. Watch weekly videos of a small group Bible study demonstration and write a reflection on what you learned about leading from the video and post in forum.
- 3. Read an assigned section from the Gospel of Mark and make notes.
- 4. **Read the textbooks and assigned articles.** The assigned chapters total about 410 pages, or about 40 pages each week.
- 5. **Participate in Forums.** In most courses, part of the learning that occurs comes through discussion and interaction with other students. In an online class, this is done through comments posted on a discussion

- forum. There will be two forums: A Reflection Forum on the video presentation, and another Reflection on the Bible study that you prepare and lead. This counts for 20 percent of the final grade.
- 6. **Handouts and Exercises** This counts for 25 percent of the final grade. You will need about 20 hours to work on these exercises an average of 2 hours per week some weeks more, some less.
- 7. Prepare for and lead a Bible study, with a group or as few as one other person once per week for 1 hour. You will spend about 2 hours preparing in addition to viewing the one-hour video which will be on the passage you will be leading. 25% of your grade.
- 8. Write one Response Paper to chapters 1-4 and another to chapters 5-8 of the Gospel of Mark, due the end of the 5th week and end of the 11th week. This is 10% of your grade.
- 9. **One final project**. You will prepare two small group Bible study meetings, with study notes and leaders notes for the entire meeting, including notes for the study and a completed manuscript. Due the end of the 12th week. 20% of your grade.
